A Note from the Dean




Dear AGO Palomar Chapter Members,

Dr. Emma Whitten to Present Lecture-Recital



Sunday, March 29, 3:00 pm Emma Whitten, organist "Organ Music for the New World" Mission San Luis Rey 4050 Mission Ave, Oceanside, CA 92057

Dr. Whitten presents a lecture-recital in the historic church of Mission San Luis Rey in Oceanside, tracing early organ music of Spain and the Americas through to the present. Emma will perform works from Spain, Italy, Mexico, and the United States, including selections from the keyboard manuscript "Sones mo Órgano" discovered in the mission of San Rafael de Chiquitos, Bolivia. Composers include José de Torres, Domenico Zipoli, Manuel de Elías, Ramón Noble, and Pamela Decker. Emma will conclude with Hans-André Stamm's Toccata Mexicana, a festive toccata derived from Aztecan drum rhythms, commissioned by the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Mexico City.

Raúl Prieto Ramírez in Recital

San Diego Civic Organist Raúl Prieto Ramírez, in conjunction with the Palomar AGO Chapter and The Village Community Presbyterian Church in Rancho Santa Fe, performed a solo organ recital on January 19, 2020, at 4 pm. About one hundred persons attended, including six AGO Palomar Chapter members. Raúl performed J. S. Bach's *Prelude and Fugue in D* (BWV 532), Claude Debussy's *Clair de lune* from *Suite Bergamasque*, and two pieces by Franz Liszt: *Symphonic Poem Prometheus No. 5* (S. 99) and *Fantasia and Fugue on the chorale "Ad nos, ad salutarem undam"* (S. 259) from Meyerbeer's opera *Le Prophete*.

I thoroughly enjoyed Raúl's recital, which was played entirely from memory. The Liszt *Fantasia and Fugue* lasted at least 30 minutes. Such a tour de force for the organ. Everyone who attended appeared to me to share my enthusiasm for Raúl's talent and personality. My thanks go to AGO Palomar Chapter member Howard McCullough who contracted Raúl through Phillip Truckenbrod Concert Artists, LLC.

Since January 2018 Raúl is the San Diego Civic Organist and Spreckels Organ Society Artistic Director. On the Spreckels organ at Balboa Park he performs between 55 and 60 different concerts a year, most of which are entirely from memory. His performances have been described with words such as "sizzling", iconoclastic", and "transcendent". Performing a wide-ranging classical and popular repertoire on the pipe organ with the flair and bravado of a matador, this Spanish master has an absolutely riveting way of entertaining general audiences of young and old, music experts and casual listeners, like remarkably few others.

After studies in Spain, Raúl moved to Stuttgart to study organ with Ludger Lohmann and, concurrently, piano with Leonid Sintsev at the Rimsky-Korsakov Conservatory in St. Petersburg. He also studied organ under Marie-Claire Alain, Guy Bovet, Eric Lebrun, Lionel Rogg, and Luigi Ferdinando Tagliavini. His compositions for chamber ensemble, pipe organ, and solo instruments have been broadcast throughout Spain and his concerto for organ and orchestra premiered in Barcelona. His transcriptions of Liszt's piano études and *Mephisto Waltz* and his interpretations of the music of Buxtehude, Bach, Franck, and Reger have been highly praised by audience and critics alike.

Raúl continues serves as the Artistic Director and Founder of the Barcelona Summer Organ Festival and Academy. Mr. Ramírez has been widely recorded and interviewed for radio and television in several European countries and in the U.S. His first two compact discs, on the Brilliant Classics label, were recorded at Milan Cathedral in Italy (music of Franck, Liszt, Reger, and Saint-Saëns) and at the Palau de la Música Catalana in Barcelona (music for piano and organ duet).

It was filled with hundreds of people who were celebrating the life of this great lady. Her children gave tender and beautiful talks about her, as did Jerry, her husband of 67 years, as well as some other people. Guests sat at tables and after the service a light luncheon was held. Carol Graham and I, with the help of my grandson made a framed photo card that featured a picture of the fruit from a Clementine fruit tree and a greeting from AGO. Carol and Bob purchased a beautiful Clementine tree and took it to the Colling's home. This is what we did representing all of you in AGO, Palomar Chapter. The Memorial was a unique and great time that I know Tina would have enjoyed and wanted for her Memorial. It was so good to be in such a positive atmosphere of love all around!



Personal note: The Worship Center is a huge building that sits on the corner in the downtown area of Carlsbad. In the long ago time a very small Community Church sat there, the first of this churches buildings. In about 1956 I moved to Carlsbad with Bill. I had been serving the La Jolla Presbyterian Church but wanted to be closer to my new home in Carlsbad. So for a little bit of time I was the organist in that small Community Church.

When Bill returned home after serving 4 years in active duty in the Air Force in Washington, England, Germany and Colorado we then had an opportunity to build a choir program at the Community Church in Vista. We worked there for about 10 years before being asked to do the same thing for the First Presbyterian Church in Oceanside. We accepted and built a very fine and extensive program which at one time included 4 vocal choirs, a handbell choir and the Year in Music and Drama Series which brought many famous organists, choirs and other musician and artists to the North County. Bill's memorial service a few years ago brought hundreds of people that filled that church.
