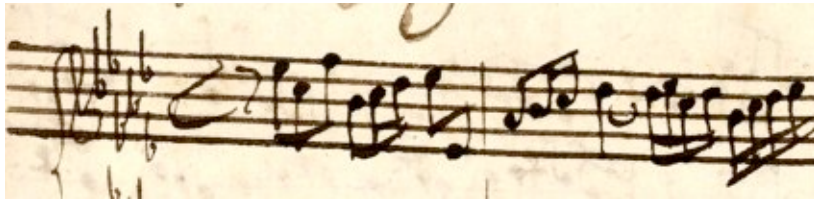

Penny Klotz Galli sits at her three-manual and pedal Noorlander Fugara virtual organ.


## A Note from the Dean

# Dinner/Recital at Penny's House

The Palomar AGO's first event for 2022-23 was an open hauptwerk organ performances and a chapter dinner prepared at the beautiful home of Penny Klotz Galli on Phoenix Way in San Marcos, California on Saturday, September 10<sup>th</sup>. Howard McCullough and Andre Kempken (a professional chef who works on a private yacht) prepared a summer meal featuring baked chicken, salads, dessert and soft drinks. Someone also brought a bottle of red and a bottle of white wine.

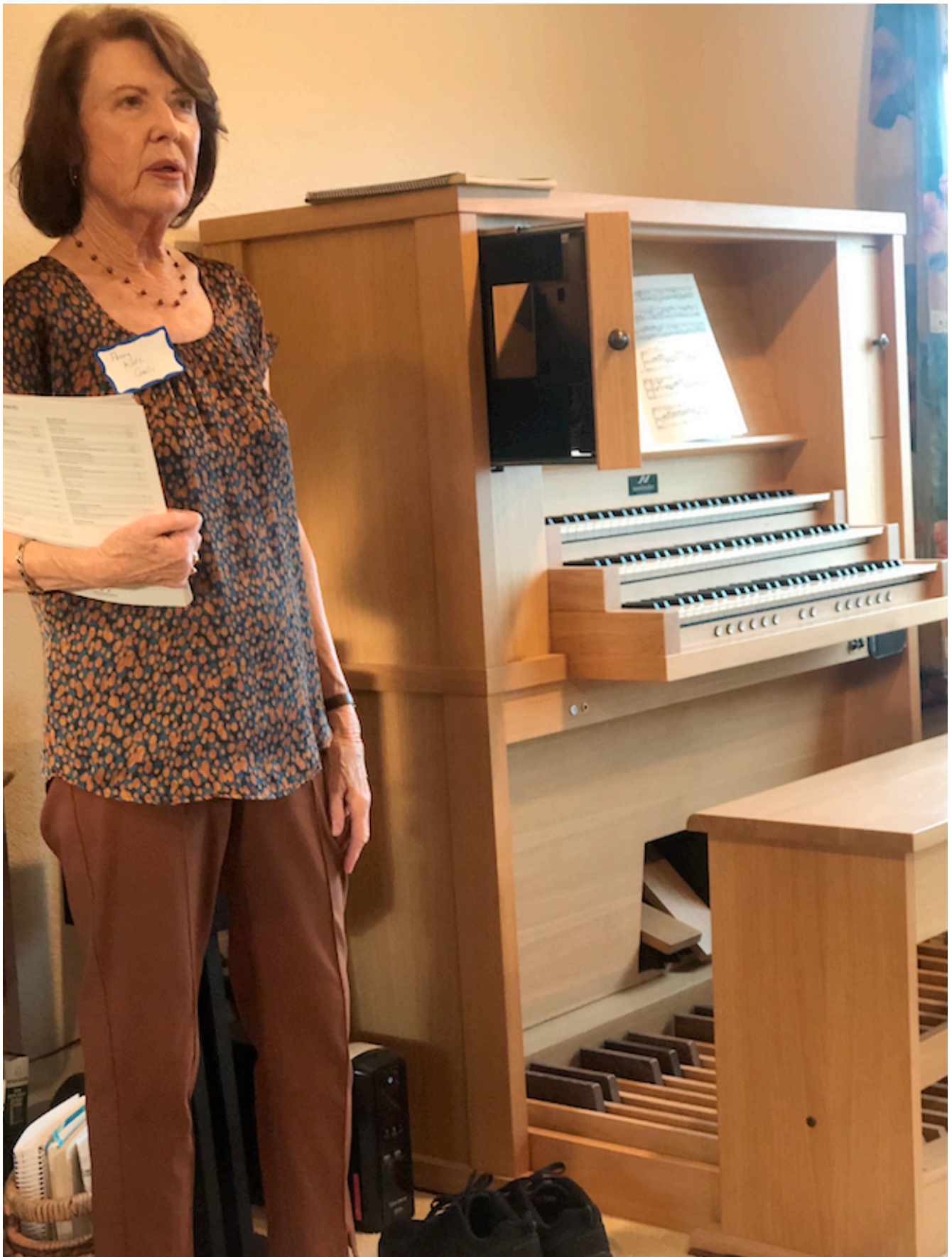
Penny explained, "The organ at our home is a three-manual and pedal Hauptwerk organ, running Windows 7 and a sample set from the Muller organ at St. Bavo Church in Haarlem, Holland. The virtual pipe organs from Noorlander are made by hand, and this Fugara model has three keyboards and a 30-tone, concave pedalboard. We placed Cambridge Audio speakers around the room project the 'Surround Sound' feature included in the digital sampling of this organ."

George Butterfield explained a bit about the three manual and pedal Noorlander Fugara Virtual Organ and also performed several numbers, including some Bach Chorales. He also assisted the performers by choosing stops and experimenting with the stops as the performers played. I heard wonderful music played by George, Michael Munson, Carol Graham (who played the *Finale from Concerto V* by Handel, and Steven Vandlen. I played *When I'm Sixty-Four* by Lennon and McCartney.

Carol Graham said, "Penny's beautiful home looks down on Palomar Hospital and has a spectacular view of the mountains." I agreed with Carol and tried to identify prominent landmarks such as the City of Escondido, I-15, CA-78 and Palomar Mountain in the distance. I did not know the names of the mountains just east and north of Escondido.

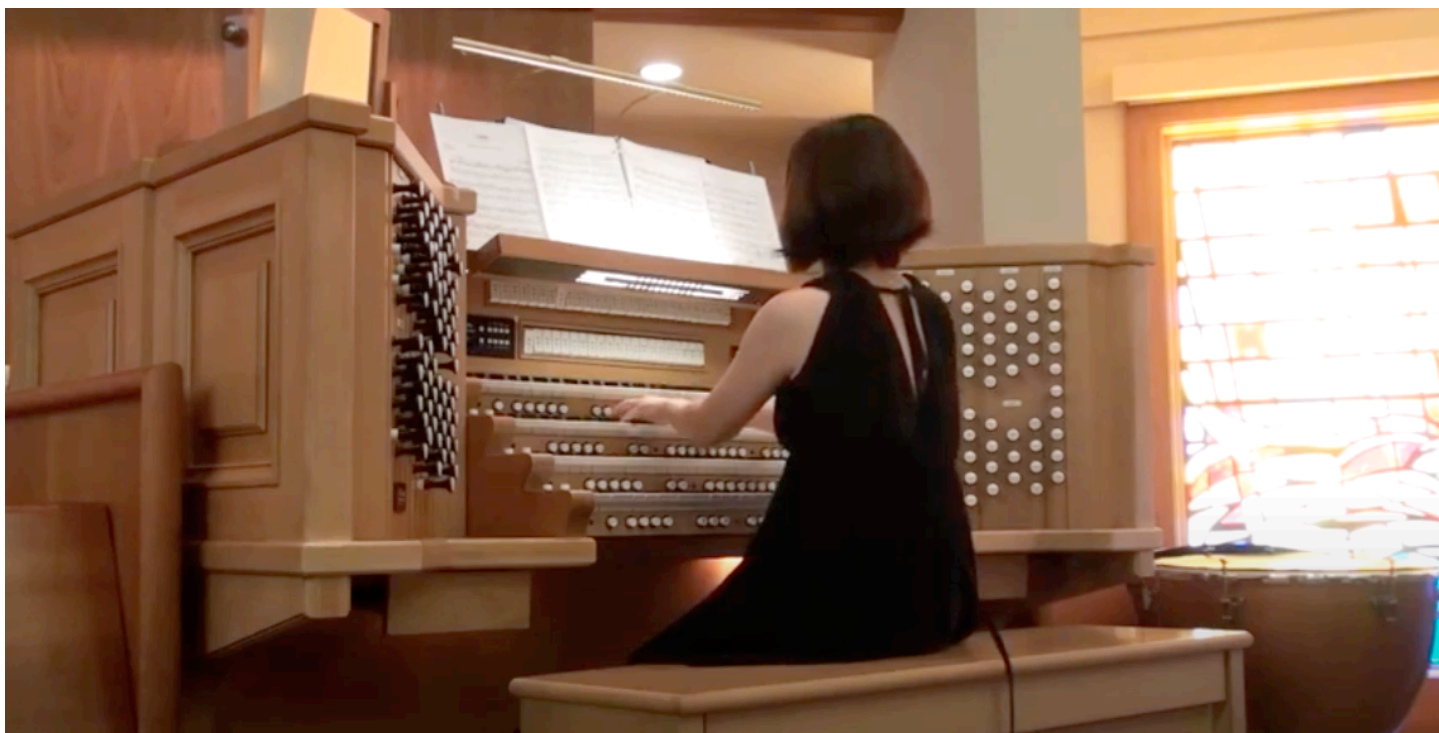
